NOMINATIONS AND APPLICATIONS SOUGHT FOR BPC 2007 C+D PRACTICE RESEARCH MEDAL

The Royal Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain is now seeking nominations and applications for the prestigious 2007 Chemist and Druggist Conference Practice Research Medal, to be presented at the British Pharmaceutical Conference (BPC) in September 2007.

This coveted award, sponsored by the C+D magazine, recognises individuals with the potential to become a leader in their field, and who have made a significant contribution to the field of pharmacy practice research.

In addition to being awarded the medal, the recipient will receive a cheque for £1,000 and will deliver a thirty minute lecture at the 2007 BPC which takes place at Manchester Central (Formerly the Manchester International Convention Centre). The lecture should be based primarily on the applicants own research but should also draw on relevant published work from related fields including health care policy.

Applicants do not necessarily have to be based in a school of pharmacy or be a registered pharmacist and international applicants are welcome. Anyone wishing to apply for this important award or to nominate a colleague, should forward:

- An academic curriculum vitae which includes details of significant grants awarded, publications and a professional and academic record including peer review experience.

- A brief supporting statement at a maximum of two (A4) pages.
- A 1,000 word lecture outline which should include the lecture title and the topics that will be covered in the lecture as well as a statement of how the research contributes to knowledge and policy in relation to healthcare generally and pharmacy practice specifically.

The RPSGB Practice Research Panel will consider the applicants, and the winner will be notified by May 2007.
